



Instructions of Low-Lite-Target-Shoot to Discipline Chairs & Assigned Range Instructors

Safety is an individual responsibility!

If you see an unsafe act = You Must Stop it! Anyone can call – Stop!

No fix

Time RSO-Chairs and assigned Range RSO's

Prep & Set-up the Range-you-are-in-charge-of *prior to* 1545L Safety-Brief including Target-, Arc-Marker-, Range Flag-, Firing Point-Flag-Glowsticks. Refrain from activating lites until before Low-Lite Safety Brief (1800L);

1545L RSO-Chair-Safety-Brief – Participants: RSO-Chairs, 2IC's and Range RSO's - Location: Club House

1600L Event-Range-Safety-Brief – All personnel (late commers equals non-shooters) – Location: outside of Club House

1610L Individual Range Briefs at active Ranges: MPR1, MPR2, HG1, HG2, Trap and Archery;

1620L Day Lite Shoots to be conducted – course of fire must be the same as Low-Lite-Shoot
RSO must do: Create a written mbr list of day-time shooters and compare list with participating LLSshooters;
Ensure each shooter demonstrates capability to switch to engage Red-Lite – without going to white lite 1st!;

1720L Break –

1745L Entire Lease on Red-Lite – violation of Red Lite Rule equals termination of the LLS by the guilty operator;

1800L All Ranges illuminated including RSO's wearing blue glowstick (1 front and 1 back);

1805L LLS-Range Safety Brief by Chief-RSO to all personnel;

1810L LLS-Range safety Brief at individual Ranges;
Dynamic Chairs only: Must execute 1-dry-run of the course of fire with ALL participants prior to
Conducting live-fire;
Enforce strict Red-Lite-Rule;

1959L Last shot fired;

2000L Case all guns and store in motor vehicles;

2005L Clean-up Ranges; and

2030L BBQ starts.

Notes:

Chairs & Duty-ROS when it is your shooting to participate in live-fire:

1. When Chair or Range RSO are participating in live fire, the 2 I/C MUST take over - if this is for some reason not possible – the Chief-RSO must be called on the Radion C/S Zero) and live fire must cease till the Chief-RSO is in location;
2. Come prepared and cater to the environment, restudy the KGAC Range Commands and Range Safety Brief;
3. Attached as an FYI are the instructions that went out to All Members; and

Lite codes:

Green glow sticks: Targets are illuminated with green glow-sticks at left-and-right-of-arc of each individual target; Metal Targets are illuminated in front of the target (at the base);

Yellow glow sticks: Range Arc-Markers are illuminated with yellow-glow-sticks;

Red glow sticks: Lease-Flag at the Lease entrance is illuminated with a red-glow-stick;

Range-Flags are illuminated with red-glow-sticks;

Firing-Point-Flags are illuminated with red-glow-sticks;

Blue glow sticks: RSO's have 2 blue glow sticks (1-in-front & 1-in-the-back);

Trap: Trap will use different means to illuminate the "sky" but will adhere-to the established colors for all else; (dimmed red-lite lites);

- All shooters must have a **head-lamp** with a red filter; and
- **No hand-held-lite** - a shooter must use both hands when operating the gun while reloading or conducting Immediate-Action-drills during stoppages.

Miscellaneous:

- Good gun control is using both hands!;
- White lite is allowed after 2000L or in case of a Medical Emergency – as per Range Safety Brief;
- Dry-firing on the unload drill is strictly enforced; and
- Tracer rounds are allowed.
